A special docket was created, as a subdivision of the criminal docket, namely the Craighead County STAR Court, a voluntary program which is conducted every Friday at 11:30 am and staffed at 10:30 am. STAR Court special docket is modeled for repeat impaired driving offenders, that is, and individual who is charged with 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} DWI offense and/or have been arrested with a BAC level of .15 or above. STAR Court is a highly

intensive monitoring program combined with treatment and patterned on the national drug court model.

b. Statutory or legal authority on which it is based:

Arkansas Supreme Court Administrative Orders 14 and 18, A.C.A. \S 5-65-103 et. Seq. and/or A.C.A \S 16-98-303 et. Seq. A.C.A. \S 16-10-139 and ACT 1044.

c. Certification of compliance with all applicable sentencing laws, including assessment, collection and remittance of fines, fees, court costs, probation fees.

We hereby certify that the Craighead County STAR Court operates in compliance with all applicable laws, including fines, court costs, participant fees, probation assessments and jail punishment.

d. Use of court resources

The STAR Court team include Judge David Boling, a coordinator, a prosecuting attorney, a public defender, probation officer, case managers, evaluator(s), treatment provider(s), an evaluation specialist from Arkansas State University and a law enforcement member. Team members have attended training programs offered by the National Center for DWI Courts (NCDC) in collaboration with the National Association of Drug Court Professionals (NADCP) and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). STAR Court was implemented and operates according to the NCDC's Ten Guiding Principles and Arkansas law

e. Sources of funding:

This specialty court was established in the circuit court administrative plan, but the judicial circuit does not have a circuit judge who is available to administer the specialty court on a consistent basis. Accordingly, the administrative plan for the judicial circuit required by Administrative Order No. 14 of the Supreme Court designated a district court judge to administer this specialty court program.
