

### "Completion" Party Held in Hot Spring County

On Monday, March 1, 2010, state and local dignitaries gathered at the Hot Spring County Courthouse to mark the completion of Hot Spring County's participation in the Arkansas Court Automation Project. Hot Spring County is the first county in the state to have both circuit and district courts fully automated on the new system.

Seventh Judicial Circuit Judge Chris Williams, Malvern District Judge Sherry Burnett and Hot Spring County Circuit Clerk Sue Jones have served on the Supreme Court Committee on Automation, which selected the case management system and guided its implementation. Ms. Jones and District Clerk Melba Russell served on the Core Team for the automation project and underwent extensive training and testing.

# **Pulaski and Garland Counties "Go Live"**

On February 16, 2010, Pulaski County Circuit Court became the 2nd circuit court in Arkansas to use the new statewide case management system, Contexte. Pulaski County Circuit Clerk, Pat O'Brien, chose Contexte over upgrading to the newer version of the County's old system. Pulaski Court Administrator, Steve Sipes, has played an instrumental role in Pulaski County's case management set up and in system customizations for Arkansas courts over the past years.

Garland County went live on Contexte on Monday March 8, 2010. Garland Circuit Clerk Vicki Rima worked in conjunction with Affiliated Computer Systems (ACS) and the AOC for the implementation. Later this year, Garland

County will use Contexte to process juvenile cases and is scheduled for the ACS Jury Management software, also provided by the AOC. There are currently five district courts and three circuit courts using the Contexte case management system.

In the coming months the Administrative Office of the Courts will be releasing ACS CourtConnect for online public access to court information, and ACS E-Traffic, an online traffic payment module. Additionally, the AOC is engaged in the development of ACS E-Juror, which will allow jurors and potential jurors to interact with the courts over the Internet. These systems also permit the sharing of justice information with state agencies, including the Office of Driver Services, and the **Arkansas Crime Information** Center. There are, also, plans to begin electronic filing projects, including the filing of law enforcement citations in Arkansas courts.

Improving public access to court information, and providing current, accurate and complete information to justice agencies to improve public safety are key tenets of the Arkansas Court Automation Project.

The Trial Court Assistants met in Little Rock the first week of March for their annual meeting. Their education agenda included sections on staying healthy, court security, identifying armed persons, pro se litigants, Arkansas Judges and Lawyers Assistance Program,, ACAP (Arkansas Court Automation Project), balancing work and life, and information about interesting web sites.

Wes Harris, ACAP Training Manager, gave a demonstration of using Contexte to manage court cases. The demonstration covered entering new court cases, adding parties (judges, defendants, attorneys, etc.) to the case, recording filings in the case, scheduling events (trial hearing), adding violations the defendant committed, disposing of the case (guilty verdict), sentencing and on-demand printing features (arrest warrant, summons, etc.).

Harris also demonstrated search capabilities, finding people that are updated weekly from Driver's Services by using their driver license record, and Court Connect, the public web search available to the public that displays case and person history information.

### **Justice Building Staying "Green"**

The Arkansas Supreme Court and all personnel in the Justice Building are continuing to do their part in recycling efforts in the State. The Supreme Court entered into a recycling partnership with a non profit organization, Profiles Productions, in March of 2008. Profiles Production serves individuals with developmental disabilities in Faulkner County and provides employment for nearly 60 individuals with handicaps.

Every ton of paper that is recycled conserves: 17 trees, 7,000 gallons of water, 4,100 kilowatts of electricity, 380 gallons of crude oil and 3.3 cubic yards of real estate normally used for landfill.

Since the partnership was initiated, the Justice Building has contributed to Profiles Production nearly 38 tons of paper, which equals 75,656 lbs of paper!!!!


