In recent years, our judicial system has made great use of modern equipment, but our technical systems are incomplete and incompatible with other systems utilized in the courts and state government.



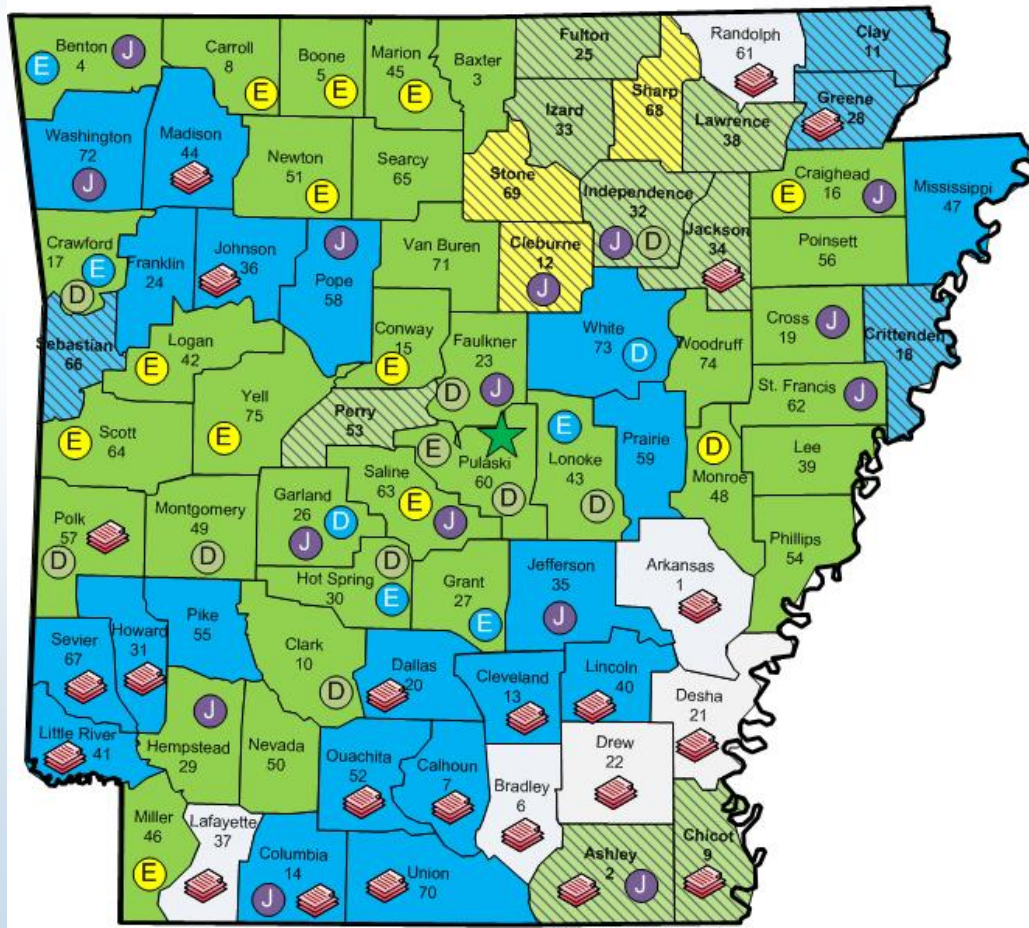
- n Courts will use jury management technology

as of October 1, 2014

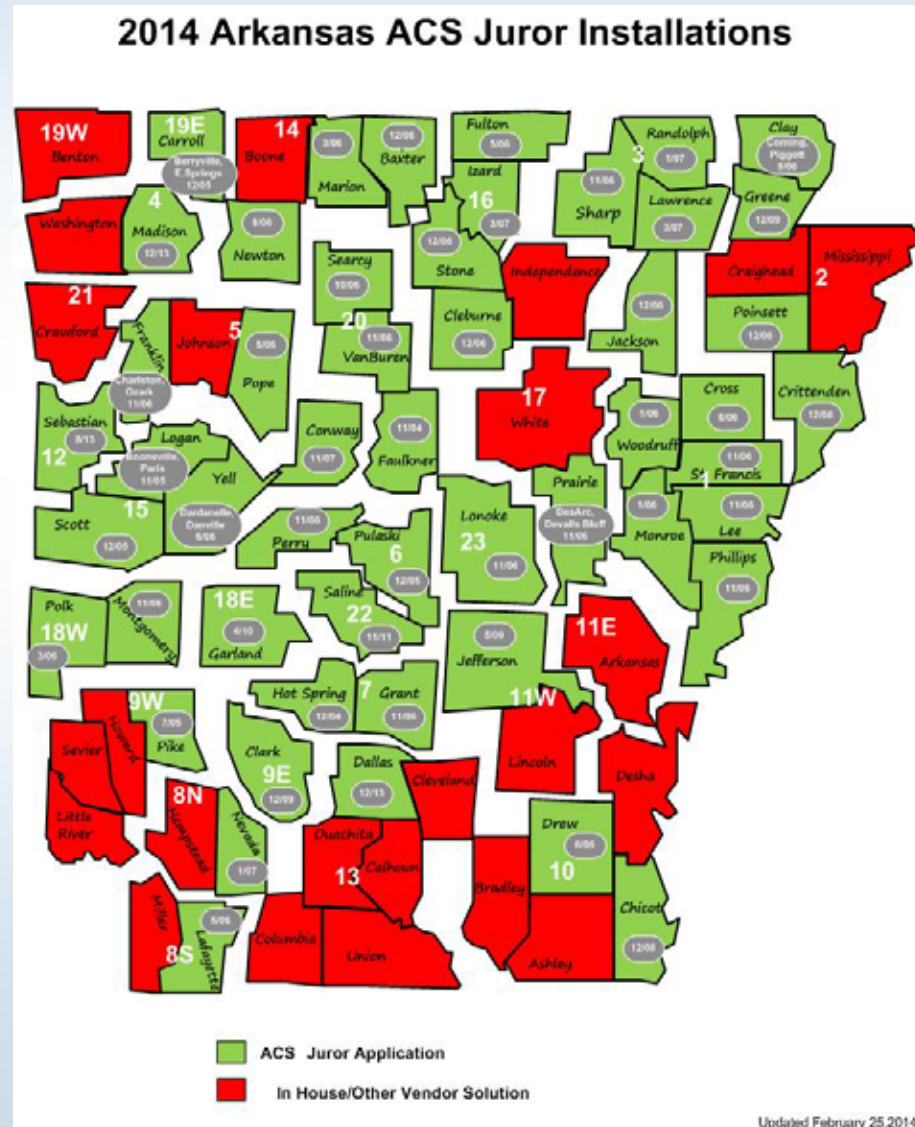



Jury Management

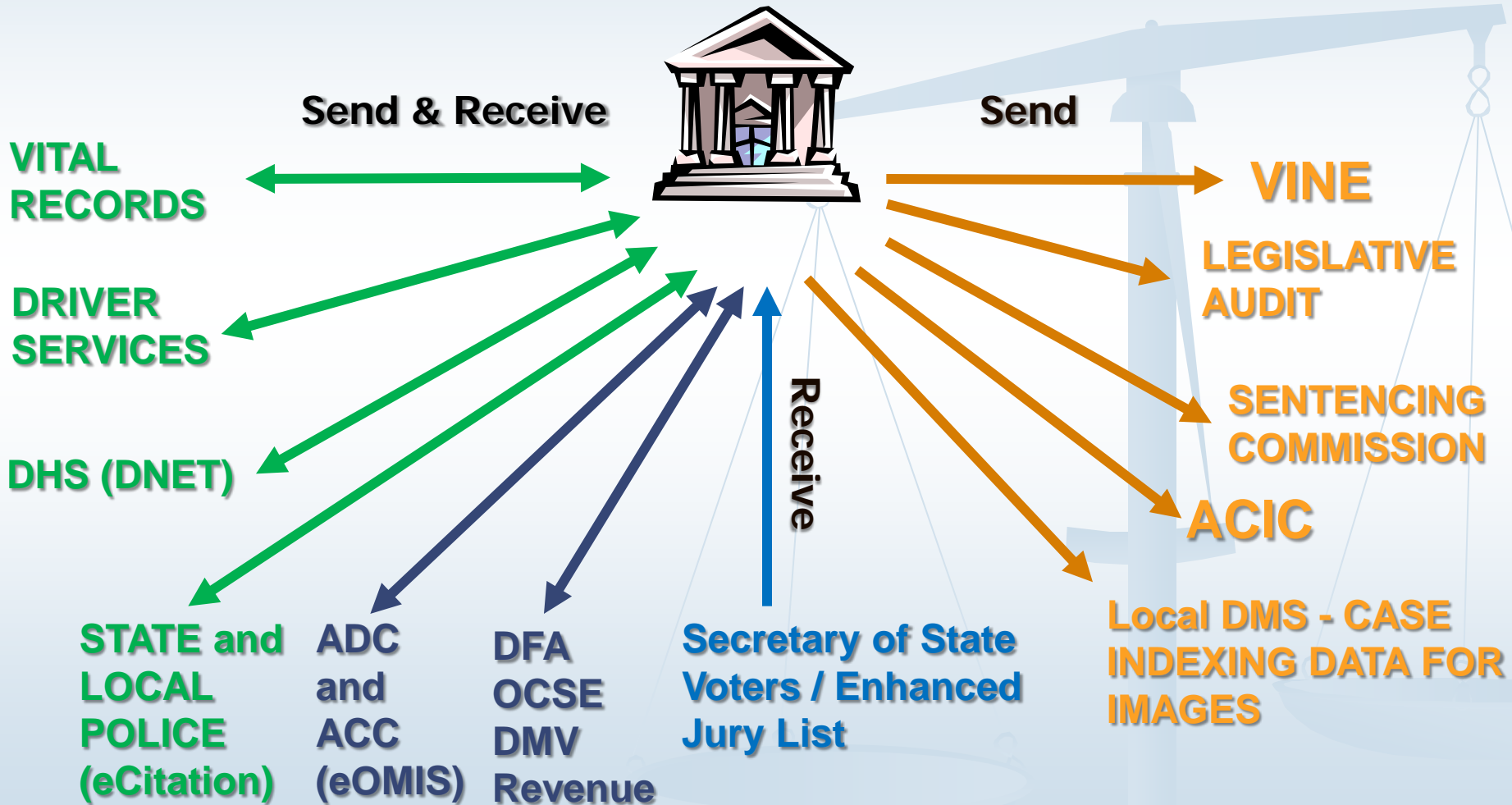
- n AOC has implemented Xerox Jury Management System in 51 counties
- n MJI web interface for jurors in 4 counties



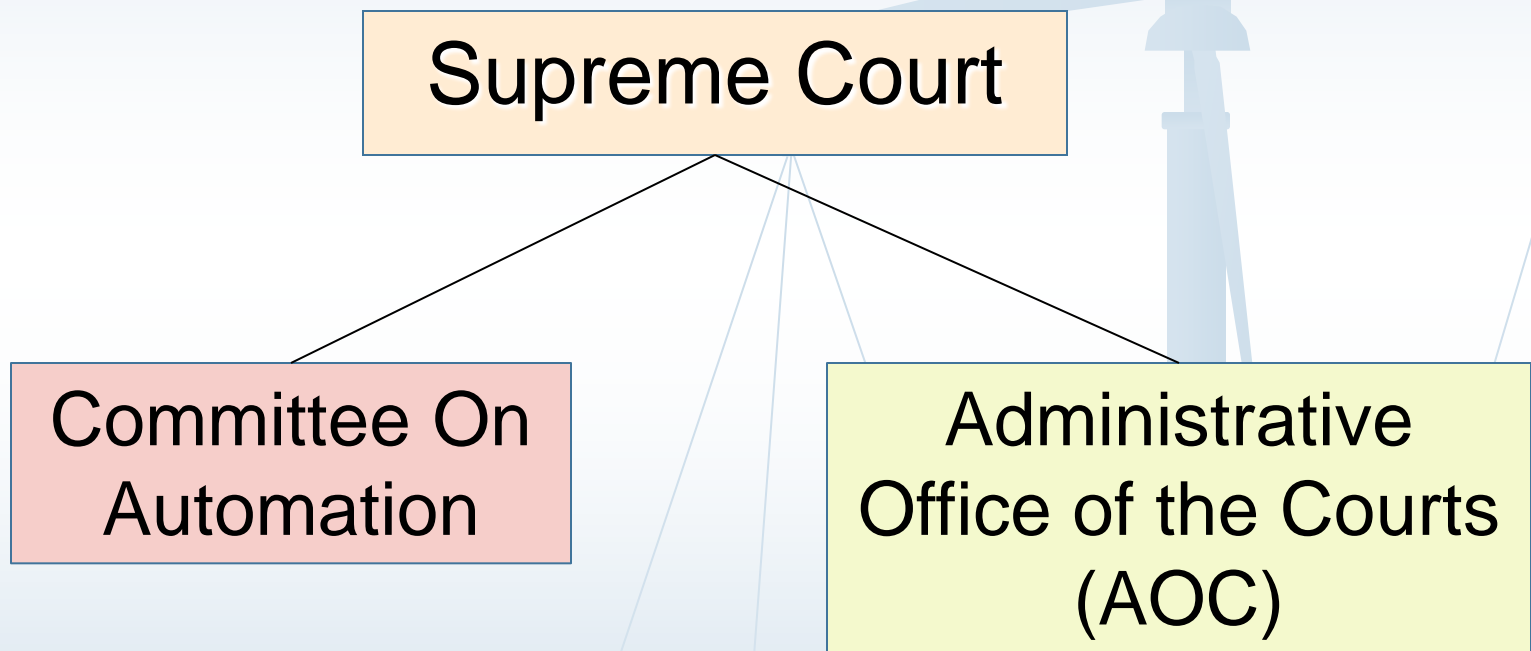

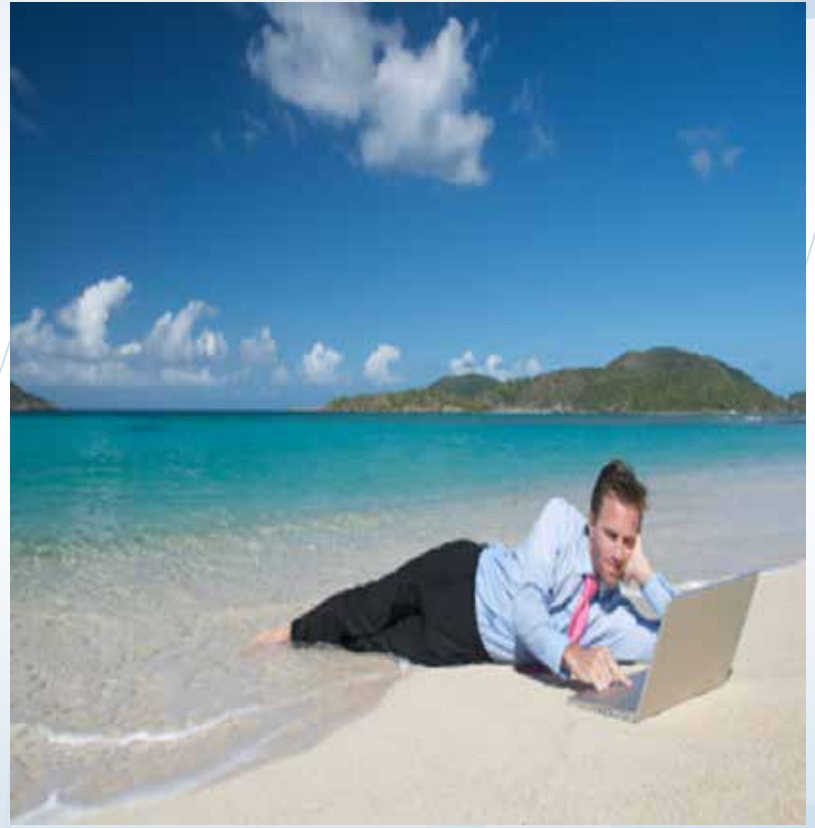
