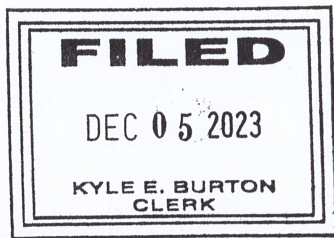


The assignment of Judge Terry to the Crawford County District Court, Van Buren Department, shall include assignment to any additional cases scheduled on the conflict date, due to the Crawford County District Judge's recusal.

This assignment includes all ancillary proceedings which may arise in connection with said causes, and proceedings subsequent thereto shall be held at such time or times as shall be directed and ordered by Judge Terry.

The assignment of Judge Terry to the Crawford County District Court, Van Buren Department entails only additional duties, and jurisdiction in the Sebastian County District Court, Fort Smith Department, Division 3, shall remain in Judge Terry to the same extent as though this assignment had not been made.
