ORDER APPROVING RECIPROCAL LICENSE SUSPENSION ACTION

The formal charges of misconduct upon which this Order is based arose from the

information provided in March 2013 by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility and

Arkansas-licensed attorney Philip K. Lyon. On March 22, 2013, the Supreme Court of Tennessee

issued the final Order of Enforcement and suspended Mr. Lyon's Tennessee law license for one

year. This reciprocal disciplinary action is filed under the authority of Section 14 of the Arkansas

Supreme Court's Procedures Regulating the Professional Conduct of Attorneys at Law

("Procedures").

Mr. Lyon, now of Jasper, Arkansas, was served with a Complaint in Arkansas, and given

notice and opportunity to provide any information why the Committee on Professional Conduct

should not seek and impose identical reciprocal discipline in Arkansas. Lyon responded with an

emailed reply on September 16, 2013, stating he did not challenge the Tennessee proceeding and

will not fight it in Arkansas. The Complaint and Lyon's response were submitted to Committee

Panel B, which voted to approve the reciprocal discipline. The one year Arkansas license

suspension shall become effective upon the date this Order is filed with the Clerk of the Supreme

Court of Arkansas.
