FINDINGS & ORDER OF DISCIPLINE

The formal charges of misconduct upon which this Findings and Order is premised arose

from information brought to the attention of the Committee on Professional Conduct by Ms. Rosa

Elena Cortez. The information related to the representation of Ms. Cortez by Bruce J. Bennett.

Ms. Cortez, who is not very fluent in English, hired Bennett in November 2004 to appeal an

adverse decision of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation Commission. Her daughter, Nathaly,

occasionally accompanied her to visits with Bennett and served as translator. Cortez obtained, for

Bennett's review, the file from her previous attorney. When Bennett received the file, he realized

that there was limited time in which to file the notice of appeal. Although he drafted the notice of

appeal, Bennett placed it into the Cortez file, but he did not file it. Subsequently, Nathaly called

Bennett's office for the status on her mother's case, and Bennet mistakenly advised Nathaly that the

notice had been filed. However, after Nathaly determined through her own investigation that the

notice of appeal had not been filed, she contacted Bennett again. Bennett then informed Nathaly that

he would attempt to take care of it, but Bennett was unable to do so.

Upon consideration of the formal complaint, attached exhibit materials, and other matters

before it, including the Arkansas Model Rules of Professional Conduct, Panel A of the Arkansas

Supreme Court Committee on Professional Conduct finds:

1. Bruce J. Bennett violated Rule 1.2(a) when he failed to abide by his client's objective in

appealing the adverse decision of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation Commission. Rule 1.2 (a)

requires that a lawyer abide by a client's decisions concerning the objectives of representation.

2. Bruce J. Bennett violated Rule 1.3 when he failed to perfect an appeal on behalf of Rosa

Cortez, thereby precluding her from seeking appellate review of the adverse decision. Rule 1.3

requires that a lawyer act with reasonable diligence and promptness in representing a client.

3. Bruce J. Bennett violated Rule 8.4(d) because his failure to timely file the notice of appeal

on behalf of Ms. Cortez as she desired caused her to not have the opportunity to have appellate

review of the adverse decision of the Arkansas Workers' Compensation Commission. Rule 8.4(d)

requires that a lawyer not engage in conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice.

WHEREFORE, it is the decision and order of the Arkansas Supreme Court Committee on

Professional Conduct, acting through its authorized Panel A, that BRUCE J. BENNETT, Arkansas

Bar No. 92140, be, and hereby is, REPRIMANDED and assessed Committee costs in the amount

of FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00) for his conduct in this matter. For his failure to file a timely response

to the formal complaint, BRUCE J. BENNETT, Arkansas Bar No. 92140, pursuant to Section 9.C(1)

and (3), has extinguished his right to a public hearing. The costs assessed herein shall be payable

by cashier's check or money order payable to the "Clerk, Arkansas Supreme Court" delivered to the

Office of Professional Conduct with thirty (30) days of the date this Findings and Order is filed of

record with the Clerk of the Arkansas Supreme Court.
