Circuit Courts Entering Judgment Information

- CDADOCT Manner of Disposition(MD)
- CDQJMTD Ctrl and PgDn
- Judgment Amount

Circuit Courts

- Judgment for P/D
 - Check Joint and Several
 - If the Judgment states Joint & Several then the recipient may collect the Judgment from any of the debtors on the case.



- **Ctrl and PgDn** (for Recipient) click ID LOV button, select party
- Judgment Amount





- Ctrl and PgDn Judgment against
 P/D
- click ID LOV button, select parties
- Select checkbox by each party who judgment is against

Circuit Courts

- Click the small black `x', go back to CDQJMTD
- Press F10 to save
- Ctrl and PgDn Assessment Type, Amount, press F10 to save, Red Door



- CDADOCT
- From the Navigation panel CDQJMTD
- Judgment Amount

District Courts

- Judgment for P/D
 - Check Joint and Several
 - If the Judgment states Joint & Several then the recipient may collect the Judgment from any of the debtors on the case.
