History

The Arkansas Supreme Court Library, founded by the Supreme Court Library Act of 1851, is the oldest operating library in the state.

The library serves the Arkansas Supreme Court and Arkansas Court of Appeals. During business hours, the library is also open to the public.

Resources

Resources include a retrospective collection of primary and secondary legal materials in print and electronic formats.

The primary focus of the collection is to support the research needs of the appellate bench. The collection secondarily serves the needs of other courts and state agencies, the practicing bar and the general public.



Equipment & Facilities

The library is located in the Justice Building on the State Capitol grounds. It offers three computers for library visitors, a scanner/copier, FAX, electric typewriter, and digital micromedia scanner/reader/printer. Study areas also are provided.

Research Services

Library staff assist visitors to locate and use collection resources to research their issues. Only licensed attorneys are allowed to give legal advice.

The library is a research-only collection and does not lend its materials.

Free Wi-Fi is provided. No charge is made to use the library. Printed pages are 10 cents each.
