

## Supreme Court Historical Society Now Accepting New Members



The Arkansas Supreme Court Historical Society, Inc. was incorporated on December 20, 1999. Its mission is to promote the preservation, dissemination and understanding of the history of the judicial department of state government through exhibits, conferences, publications, and other activities.

To promote these goals, the Society:

- Sponsors a continuing series of articles published by the Arkansas Bar Association in its publication, *The Arkansas Lawyer*. Beginning in 2005, these articles include histories of important Arkansas Supreme Court decisions and biographical sketches of Arkansas Supreme Court justices.
- Accepted portraits of retired Arkansas Supreme Court justices. Most recently in April, 2015, the Society received the portrait of Chief Justice Jack Holt, Jr. (1985-1995). The portraits are displayed within the Justice Building. In 2015, the Society added to its website interviews with fifteen retired Arkansas Supreme Court justices.
- Cooperated with the Justice Building exhibits program to develop conferences on historical topics complementing exhibit themes, including Racial Justice (2004), Women and the Law (2005), Arkansas Constitutions (2006), American Courthouses (2007), the Arkansas Supreme Court and the Civil War (2012).

The Society is governed by the board of directors elected by its dues-paying membership. Membership is maintained on a calendar-year basis, and is open to anyone with an interest in Arkansas legal history. Individual annual dues are \$25. Partnership, corporation or company annual dues are \$500, which entitles the firm to name up to 10 individual members. Special rates are provided for students (\$10 annual dues), and non-profit organizations or educational institutions (\$75 annual dues, which entitles the organization or institution to name up to 3 individual members). The 2016 membership form is now available online.

# 2016 Judicial Election Candidates

The filing period for the 2016 Nonpartisan Judicial Election closed on November 9, 2015. The ballot will include contested races for two state-wide Supreme Court positions, two Court of Appeals Districts and four Circuit Court judgeships. Terms for all of the state's District Court judgeships will also expire and several contested races will appear on local ballots.


With the resignation of former Chief Justice Jim Hannah and the expiration of the interim appointment of Chief Justice Howard Brill, two candidates are seeking the Chief Justice position. They include Associate Justice Courtney Goodson and Circuit Judge Dan Kemp. Seeking the position currently held by Associate Justice Paul Danielson are Circuit Judge Shawn A. Womack and Clark W. Mason.


Each of the judicial positions and the registered candidates is shown on this list. The election will be held on March 1, 2016.





Justice Rhonda Wood and Connie
Hickman Tanner were selected to
present at the Models for Change 10th
Annual Working Conference on the
Arkansas Supreme Court Commission
on Children, Youth and Families and
its work on Juvenile Justice Reform.
In September 2014, the Commission
adopted the four principles outlined
in the Core Principles for Reducing
Recidivism and Improving Outcomes for
Youth. It summarized the latest research
into the following four key principles:

Principle 1: Base supervision, service,

and resource allocation decisions on the results of validated risk and needs assessments.

Principle 2: Adopt and effectively implement programs and services demonstrated to reduce recidivism and improve other youth outcomes, and use data to evaluate the results and direct system improvements.

Principle 3: Employ a coordinated approach across service systems to address youths' needs.

Principle 4: Tailor system policies, programs, and supervision to reflect the distinct developmental needs of adolescents.

Justice Wood chairs the Juvenile Justice Committee, which is diligently working with various judicial leaders and stakeholders on a strategic plan to implement these principles. To further this work, the AOC has received a grant from the MacArthur Foundation to implement a risk and needs assessment to aid judges with delinquency disposition decision making, probation terms, and case planning. The AOC has also received a grant from the State Justice Institute to receive technical assistance from the Robert F. Kennedy Resource Center for Juvenile Justice.
