Advantages of eFiling

- Reduced cost of office supplies
- Instant access to case documents
- Less storage space needed
- Reduced phone calls, office traffic, mail, and faxes

Some things you still must do in Contexte

- Search for party IDs.
- Add statistical docket codes and associate them
- Associate a party to statistical docket codes in criminal and juvenile cases.
- Adding and Disposing of Violations
- *Hint: Take advantage of eFlex Queues (To-do Lists)


Items Reviewed for Data Quality Comparison


- Reviewed data quality of a few eFiling courts before and after eFiling began related to 4 areas.
 - MF docket code added to a case
 - MD docket code added after disposition
 - @IDs increase or decrease
 - Party associated to MF/MD codes in criminal and juvenile


Manner of Filing Docket Code on New Cases Filed


- Reviewed a sample of eFiling courts before and after eFiling began.
- Did it take more than 7 days after the case was filed for the Manner of Filing docket code to be added?













Manner of Disposition Docket Code on Criminal Cases After Certain Closing Orders

- Reviewed a sample of eFiling courts before and after eFiling began.
- After certain closing orders were filed, did it take 7-100 days for the Manner of Disposition docket code to be added?
 - JJ05 Sentencing Order
 - OR752 Order Nolle Prosequi
 - ORCOD Order to Dismiss
 - JU28 Judgment Dismiss


Trend - Manner of Disposition Docket Code on Criminal Cases After Certain Closing Orders




TREND – Manner of Disposition Docket Code Added to Criminal Cases 7-100 days after Closing Order





Trend - Use of @IDs in Criminal and Juvenile Cases Before and After eFiling


